**1** Bauma Town Hall, or Gemeindehaus.

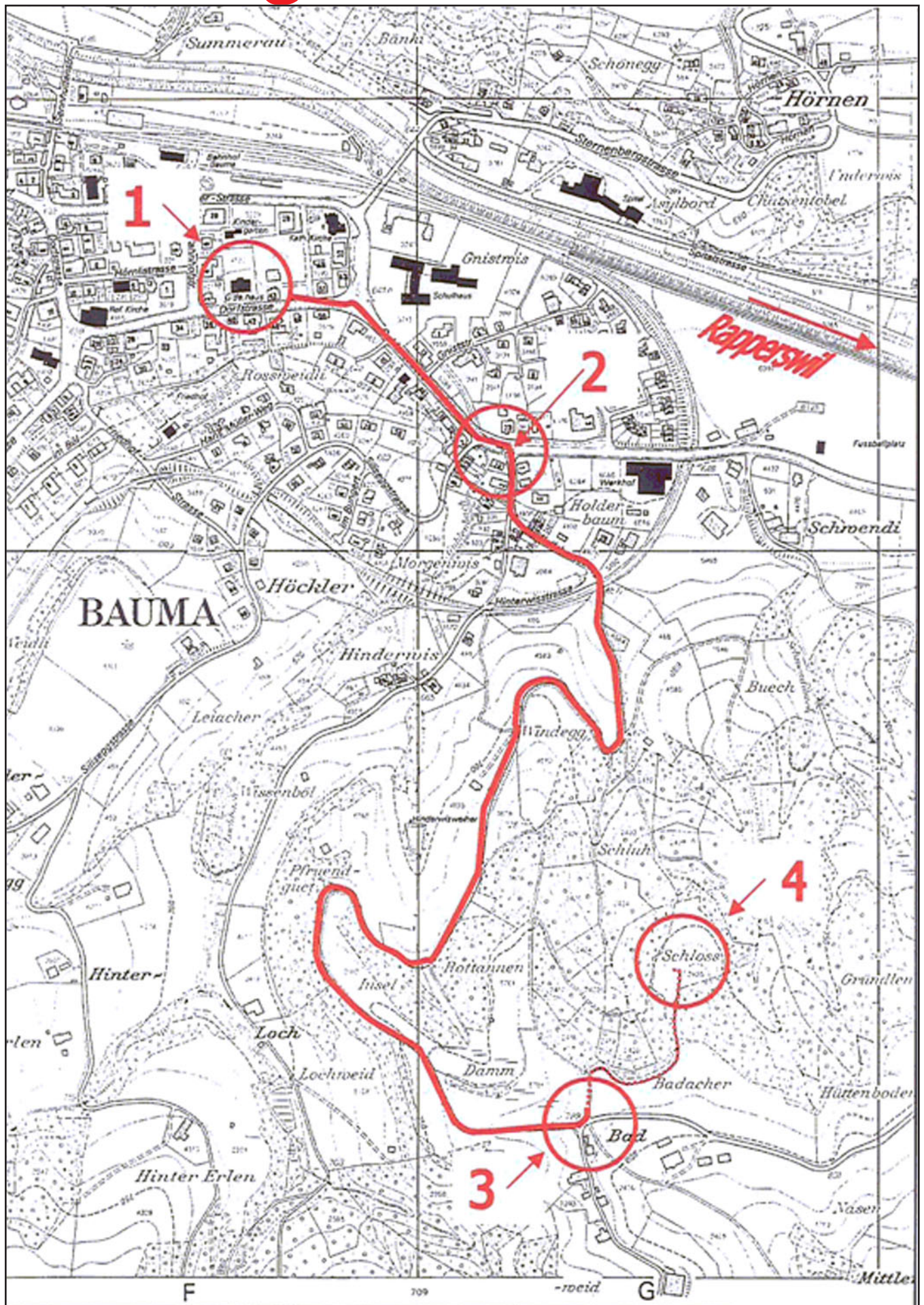
**2** Street sign to the Wolfensberg, site of the Wolfensberger Family Memorial.

# Bauma: Where Our Family Got Its Start

**B**auma is the ancestral home of the worldwide Wolfensberger family which traces its ancestry to a long-vanished medieval mountaintop castle on the Wolfensberg. History records neither the precise construction date or the castle nor the date it was demolished, but a 1560 map of the region prominently displays the Wolfensberger family coat of arms at this site.

In partnership with the community of Bauma, the Bauma tourist information office (*Verkehrsverein*), and the cantonal hiking association (*Zuercher Wanderwege*), the Wolfensberger Family Association of the United States of America dedicated a public memorial to the family on the original site of the castle on September 28, 2001.

Visitors are welcome to park at the entrance to a hiking path that leads up to the memorial. Carefully follow the gravel path uphill to the site, a distance of less than 200 yards. At the end of the pathway, you'll find the Wolfensberger Family Memorial stone and a picnic area that is open to the public.

Visitors are welcome to prepare meals over a fireplace at the site, then sit back and enjoy the scenery of majestic Switzerland, the historic homeland of the Wolfensberger family.
