John W. Sparger, born John Wolfenbarger, in Pennsylvania August 17 1754, died in Ohio Nov. 17 1840. He married Christina Frey a daughter of Valentine Frey, in the South Fork section of what was then Surry County in 1777 or 1778. The settlement is now known as Friedberg and is located about nine miles from Winston-Salem in Forsythe County N.C. She was born in Pennsylvania Nov. 22 1759, died in Surry County N.C. between 1830 and 1833. He went from Lancaster County Pa. where the early family settled some time between 1761 and 1771 to Shenandoah Co. Va. with his father and family. The first record found of his father in Virginia was when he took oath as Vestryman in Beckford Parish in 1771. It is thought possible that he was in Pennsylvania as late as April 12 1767, since on that date it is recorded in Shafferstown Reformed Church that John Wolfersberger and wife were sponsors, when John Wolfersberger, a son of Phillipp Wolfersberger and his wife Margaret was baptized. John and Phillipp were brothers and it is natural to suppose that John and his wife would have stood sponsors for this child at his baptism. It is also significant that at the baptism of another son, John Phillipp on Sept. 8 1769, that another brother, Peter and his wife apponia stood sponsors, further indicating that possibly John had left Pennsylvania and gone to Virginia where he was found in 1771. A record of the Wolfenbarger family has been separately compiled, and John of Shenandoah Co. Va. is referred to in that record as No. 4.

The first record of John W. Sparger (John Wolfesberger) is at Winston-Salem in the Moravian Archives, which reads as follows. " Dec. 9 1776 A man by the name of Wolfesberger who formerly lived near Lititz Pa. (An old Moravian settlement at which point a church is still maintained 1955) but is now in Virginia, made an agreement with Br. Craff to buy 300 acres on Spark's Creek. His son will settle there " This land is near the Friedberg Moravian Church which is being maintained at the present time. The Moravian Ledgers show that John Wolfesberger was in possession of this land in 1778 and 1779. It is not known under what arrangement he was in possession of the 300 acres of land referred to, probably on a rental basis, since the ledgers show that on May 31 1781 an entry was made charging the rental to profit and loss, amounting to 16 pounds and 16 shillings for the two years 1778 and 1779. He had probably been unable to make his payments, and moved away or was dispossessed of the land.

A bit of interesting information is contained in a little sketch by Joseph Spargur Jr., a grand-son of John, in 1876 in which he says " John W. Spargur our grand-father was born in Pennsylvania, lived there for a time, then lived for a time in Grayson Co. Va., and removed to North Carolina in 1787 "

The records at Danbury, county seat of Stokes Co. N.C. show that John Wolfesberger was granted 150 acres of land on Feb'y 22 1787, the same year that his grandson, Joseph Jr. said he came to North Carolina. Now it appears that about what happened was that when he left the Moravian settlement

State grants of land in that county in 1794, and one in 1802. All records refer to John W. Sparger after that date and many deeds were made to John Sparger, and many of these deeds and grants to John Sparger are located on both sides of Forkner's Creek, and John Sparger Sr. owned hundreds of acres of land on this creek. John Sparger Sr. and John Sparger Jr. owned and traded in slaves. He lived in Surry Co. N.C. until 1833 after the death of Christina his wife. The United States census records show that she was living in 1830, so she died between 1830 and 1833. Several of his children moved to Highland County Ohio from time to time beginning with Joseph and Reuben in 1804, Philipp in 1809 and in 1833 he accompanied his son Henry and his bride, (tradition saying that he rode a pony) to Ohio where he lived until his death Nov. 17 1840. He is buried there in a Quaker cemetery.

Here it seems appropriate to give a little history of Christina's side of the house, by making reference to the record of the Frey family which has been compiled separately but made a part of this record. She was a daughter of Valentine Frey and his wife, Anna Maria Barbara Binckelc Frey, and a granddaughter of Peter Frey and his wife Anna Barbara Schmidt (Her maiden name is obtained from his will on file at Salisbury N.C. which at the time of his death was as it is now the County seat of Rowan Co., but Rowan at that time included that territory now covered by Surry, Forsythe and Stokes Co.

There is no record that John or Christina ever connected themselves with the Moravian Church, although their first two children were baptized by the Moravians, however the records show that Christina's parents and grandparents on both sides were devout communicants of the Moravian Church.

John and Christina were the father and mother - or founders of the Sparger and Spargur families in this country, and their descendants are scattered all over the world.

The members of the family who went to Ohio adopted the spelling " Spargur " while those who remained in North Carolina spell it " Sparger "

According to the best information obtainable, Christina is buried in an old country grave-yard in Surry Co. N.C., near Mount Airy N.C. in sight of the site of the old home, adjoining the property of the Sparger Orchard Company. This is known as the "Taylor Grave Yard " There is a group of four graves, said to be those of, Christina Sparger, Hannah Deatheridge, Christina's daughter, John W. Sparger, her son and Robert Turner Taylor, who married Jane Taylor her granddaughter, and daughter of John W. Sparger. These graves are not marked so they can be identified, but they simply have rough stones placed at the head and foot of each grave. Of course no one is living now who was here at the time these people died, so we are entirely dependent upon what has been handed down to those now living. The traditions about these burials were personally investigated by J. B. Sparger and W. M. Creasy (both descendants of Christina) in September 1931 and the above information was obtained from some of the older descendants of these people and there seems to be no reason to doubt that this data is correct.

One of the stories handed down in the family is that one of his brothers went to see him after he went to Ohio, and as soon as he came in sight and hearing of him, he called

the City of Winston* Salem N.C. which City was founded by the Moravians about 1766, the site having been selected by casting lots. He married Rachel Sumner in North Carolina (1), who was born in N.C. Dec. 4 1786 and died in Ohio Oct. 3 1823. He married Abigail Moore (2) who was born Jan'y 5 1807 d Jan'y 23 1886. Ten children were born to the first marriage and eight to the second. With No xviii Reuben W. Spargur, the record of the descendants of Joseph W. Spargur No. 2, second son of John Wolfenbarger (Spargur - Sparger) is concluded. Of course there are myriads of other of whom we have been unable to get trace. We now proceed with a similar record of the descendants of John W. Sparger No. 3, third son of John Wolfenbarger etc.

John W. Sparger b about 1778 probably near Freidberg N.C. The Moravian records of the Friedberg Moravian Church show that two of his brothers were born there in 1779 and 1781 but make no mention of John, however the records in Surry County N.C. show that an early date John Sparger Sr. and John Sparger Jr. were business partners before any of the other brothers were mentioned and it is therefore concluded that John was the oldest son, and that the family records showing that he died in 1834 aged 55 is in error as to his age since that would have made the year of his birth, the same as that of his brother Reuben, 1779. (Tradition says that the old family Bible was lost or destroyed, and a new one was rewritten by some member of the family from information collected from the memory of various of the older members, making it possible for errors to slip in) He married Sarah Lyon of near Hillsville Va. about 1816. She was born Feb'y 4 1799 and died Jan'y 1 1860 (Dates of her birth and death are taken from her tomb stone in the church yard at Salem Methodist Church, near Mount Airy Surry Co. N.C. He is buried about four miles from Mount Airy (In what is known as the old Taylor Grave Yard) near the road leading to Brower's Springs, and near the land of the Sparger Orchard Company, where his mother Christina Frey Wolfenbarger - Sparger, his sister Hannah Sparger Deatheridge, and his son in law Robert Turner Taylor are buried. In graves marked only by rough stones without inscriptions of any nature. In later years a marker to the memory of Robert Turner Taylor was erected by his sons Rev. Robert Marion Taylor, and Frank Taylor in the church yard at Salem Church by the side of his wife Jane Sparger Taylor, but his mortal remains still rest in the old grave yard on the hill near Brower's Springs, and overlooking the site of the last home of Christina Sparger, probably the first person buried there. Her husband John W. Sparger went to Highland County Ohio with his son Henry soon after her death where they joined the

Murlin Sparger was born May 15 1817, and died of cancer, near Mount Airy N.C. Nov. 16 1877 in his 61st. year. He was happily married to Miss Bethania Cook in December 1838. They were the parents of ten children, five sons and five daughters all of whom are living (1878) and were with their father at the time of his death, a death never having occurred in the family before. These we believe with a single exception are all consistent members of the Methodist Episcopal Church South. When he came to Surry County he was a man of very limited means and had very little educational advantages, but he was a man of physical and mental force. He had native ability. Only a practical experimental development was want-

This fact may be largely if not wholly attributed to his efficacy and influence. The blood of his neighbor or his neighbor's children will never cling to his skirts for tolerating this evil. The full weight of his influence was thrown against it. He was a man of decided character, upright in principles and pretty sound in judgement. He sustained largely the relation of adviser and peace maker to his community. He was rather looked up to as the center and head of the community. In most business plans and operations his advice was generally sought and followed. Often he would settle difficulties and harmonize parties at variance in the neighborhood. Possibly no man in his community or anywhere else had fewer difficulties with men than himself. If he had an enemy he knew it not.

HIS CONVERSION AND CHURCH RELATIONSHIP.

He was converted about the year 1842 under the ministry of the now glorified John M. Gunn, and joined the Methodist Episcopal Church. At the time of a protracted meeting held in the neighborhood he was accidentally crippled so that he could not attend. A meeting was held in his own home for his special benefit. He was happily converted and since then until his death he was a faithful consistent member of the Methodist church.

He was for many years a class leader, steward and Sunday school Superintendent. In all these relations he served his church well. He contributed much to the spiritual welfare of the class of which he was a worthy leader. The Sunday School prospered under his management. The finances of the church were never allowed to fall short while he was a steward. He kept up the home altar as long as he was able and endeavored faithfully to train up his children both by precept and example in the way they should go. "He was a good man and full of the Holy Ghost and faith" His peace was as a river and his righteousness as the waves of the sea. In all his relations, his example was worthy of imitation. ----- Signed (James Wilson

Note - For lack of space it has been found necessary to curtail this memorial which was written by the Presiding Elder of the District in which Mount Airy was located at the time. This matter has been reproduced from two badly mutilated newspaper clippings. One of them in my mother's scrap book, and the other sent to me from Bonham Texas by Mrs. Martha Clark, one of his nieces in 1931 (Mrs. Clark died in June 1932) Some parts of each clipping were illegible, so it was necessary to use both to obtain a complete copy.

MEMORIAL TO BETHANIA SPARGER

Her maiden name was Bethania Cook. She was born in Surry County N.C. January 14 1817 and died April 27 1884, and hence was 67 years, 3 months and 23 days old. She was most happily married in 1838 to Murlin Sparger, who preceeded her to the spirit land about six and one half years. In this happy relationship she lived about 46 years. She became the mother of ten children - five sons and five daughters - all of whom are now living (1884

and a half months - lingering and suffering, long and patiently. As in her life, so in her suffering, she did not murmur. Death was not unexpected to her. She looked for it contrary to the hopes of others. To her it was no dread. Its sting was gone. Her victory was complete - her triumph full. In her calmer, clearer moments she took a very proper view of the change she was slowly but surely approaching and hence set her "house in order in a two fold sense - temporal and spiritual. Calling her children about her, before the shadows and clouds of death had darkened her vision, and talking to them in a conscious, intelligent manner, and sending her messages to various relations and friends, with special request " Meet me in Heaven " she quietly suffers, awaiting the change. As the fading summer cloud or dying wave, so she passed beyond " The weeping and the mortal.

Sister Sparger was of a quiet and meek disposition - a most affectionate mother and kind neighbor. Her acts of kindness and words of comfort and cheer will long be remembered by those who were with her most and knew her best. She was universally esteemed by her community. Even many colored people attended her funeral service, and shed a tear at the grave of this good woman.

Bethania Cook was a daughter of John Cook, son of Henderson Cook. Her mother was Edith Jessup, daughter of Jacob Jessup, son of Joseph Jessup, son of Thomas Jessup II., son of Thomas Jessup I., who immigrated from Leeds England with his wife and one son Thomas Jessup II. and landed at New Bern N.C. in 1722. He settled first in Petquimans Co. N.C. Probably he and his wife died there. He was born in England about 1790. Murlin and Bethania Sparger were grandparents of W.H. Creasy, compiler of this record. He was a renowned Methodist preacher, filling many of the leading Churches in North Carolina. Below is copied a prayer offered at her funeral service by Rev. W. B. Poovey, Mt Airy District.

" Our Heavenly Father ! There is a note of sadness in our voices when we sing, " Asleep in Jesus " There is a feeling of sadness in our hearts as we sit in the presence of death. But mingled with the note of sadness is a note of triumph and a sense of gratitude.

This is a day of coronation for the queen of a Christian home; and the occasion when we come to lay the wreath of victory upon the head of another heroine of the Methodist Parsonage.

As we pay the last, loving tribute to the memory of Mrs Walter S. Creasy, we would give Thee thanks that in thy good providence she was permitted to spend the days of her childhood and youth, and young womanhood in the delightful surroundings of this beautiful section, and that something of this beauty was builded into her lovely character. We thank Thee that when the man of God came this way in his gospel ranging, her pure soul was joined with his in the great spiritual advancement. We thank Thee that by her devotion to the home tasks, and her helpfulness in whatever field her preacher-husband was assigned, he was so enheartened for his ever enlarging field of service in the Master's name, and that his impress and influence abide over the wide area from the mountains to the sea.

But we also thank Thee that when her sainted husband went to his reward more than thirty years ago, this good woman chose to spend the years of her widowhood in the community of her girlhood, serving in her quiet way in the Church of her young womanhood. And we should not forget to give Thee thanks, our dear Heavenly Father, for the high courage, uncomplaining patience and christian fortitude so beautifully exemplified by the way in which the sufferings of the closing years of her life were borne.

An finally dear Father we feel to thank Thee that, on this her coronation day, her friends of her early, and her later years may come together and mingle their tears with her children and kindred as they pay the last tribute of love to her precious memory.

May the gospel which her sainted husband lived and loved and preached and may the grace which sustained her in her years of active service as well as in the years of her invalidism and suffering be the strength and comfort of those who, to day feel so keenly the severance of earth ties.

And may our lives be so consecrated to holy tasks, and so dedicated to doing Thy will; that when each one of us shall come to the end of the way, and take final leave of earthly friends, they may as surely know our destination as we to day know the destination of this dear soul that has gone from our midst. Sanctify this occasion to the eternal good of every soul and at the last gather us to that Place prepared for us and to which our departed, and sainted kindred have gone; and when we are permitted to join them we shall be able to offer Thee more perfect praise in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS? THAT WE, HENRY SPARGER AND WILLIAM MCCRAW. are held and firmly bound unto William Miller, Governor, or his successors in office, in the full sum of five hundred pounds, current money to be paid to the said Governor, his successors and assigns, for the which payment, well and truly do be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 25 day of October Anno Domini 1816.

The condition of the above obligation is such. That whereas the above bounden Henry Sparger hath made application for license for marriage to be celebrated between him and Susannah Roberts in the County aforesaid. Now in case it shall not appear hereafter that there is any lawful cause or impediment to obstruct the said marriage, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

Henry W. Sparger was probably born in Surry County N.C. or Botetot Co. Va. in that section now comprising Grayson County. He went from Surry Co. N.C. to Highland County Ohio in 1833 accompanied by his wife and family, including his venerable father John W. Spargur. between 1830 and 1833. The U.S. Census reports show that Christina was living in 1830, but all other information shows that she was dead in 1833 when the old man went to Ohio. Children of Henry W. This record of course is far from being complete or sat-
isfactory to the writer, but contains all of the infor-
mation available on the subject, which has been collected
from all over the country, extending over a period of more
than five years.

WOLFENBARGER FAMILY

The following information has been collected and compiled by W.H. Creasy of Wilmington N.C., assisted by J.B. Sparger of Mount Airy, Surry County N.C., the home of the original Sparger family. Mr Sparger has visited personally many of the county court houses and obtained valuable data from the records.

The services of genealogists in Washington, Philadelphia, Harrisburg Pa., Richmond Va. and various other places have been utilized in the collection of this data. This record is not as complete in some respects as we would like but there seems to be no doubt that the direct descent of the Sparger family from a man called John Wolfspairer in the Court Records, who obtained a land grant in Lancaster County Penn. in 1734, later being naturalized under the name of John Wolfespargar April 11 1744 in Philadelphia has been proven. Change the "i" into "g" in Wolfespairer and you have Wolfesparger, or in other words, John W. Sparger. It can be easily seen how the name Sparger originated from the name first used and spelled in various forms. Before proceeding with the family record and history, a copy of the naturalization certificate in which the name of John Wolfespargar is included, is quoted.

TO RICHARD PETERS ESQ'R, SECRETARY OF THE PROVINCE
OF PENNSYLVANIA.

I do hereby certify that at a supreme court held in Philadelphia for the province of Pennsylvania, before John Kinsey, Thomas Crame and William Till, Esq'rs.; judges of said Court, the tenth, eleventh and twelfth days of April in the year of Our Lord, one thousand, seven hundred and forty four, between the hours of nine and twelve of the clock in the forenoon of the same days the foregoing subscribed persons being foreigners and having inhabited and resided the space of seven years in his Majesty's colonies in America and not having been absent out of some of the colonies for a longer period than two months at any one time during the said seven years, and having provided the Court certificates of having taken the sacrament of the Lord's Supper within three months before the said Court; took and subscribed the oath and did make an repeat the Declaration appointed by an Act made in the First Year of the Reign of His Majesty, King George First., according to the directions of an Act of Parliament made in the thirteenth year of the Reign of His present Majesty, King George the Second entitled an Act for Naturalizing such foreign Protestants and others therein mentioned as are settled or shall settle in any of His Majesty's Colonies in America, and thereupon were admitted to be His Majesty's Natural born Subjects of the Kingdom of Great Britain pursuant to the direction and intent of said Act of Parliament.

Thirty three names are entered under the heading of the certificate, then there is the following sub-heading under which seven names are entered in the same form

The persons whose names are subscribed being foreigners and of the people called Quakers, and other Protestants who conscientiously scruple the taking of an oath, severally took the affirmation and made the declaration according to the directions of the Act of Parliament past in the thirteenth year of the Reign of his Present Majesty King George the Second, intituled An Act for Naturalizing Foreign Protestants and an Act of The General Assembly of the Province in the Year of Our Lord 1742.

Immediately following the complete list of names on the above naturalization certificate is the following.

The persons before named having intituled themselves to the benefit of the Act of Parliament aforesaid, a list of their names is to be transmitted to the Commission for trades and plantations. To which end in pursuance of the said Act. I have caused their names to be made known.

A photostatic copy of the original of the above document is in the possession of W.M. Creasy, Wilmington N.C. and the original is on file in the archives of the State Library of Pennsylvania at Harrisburg, Pa.

In writing the records of the family, an effort will be made to follow the spelling of the names as used in the records wherever found, which of course will show the many ways in which the name was spelled in the early days. The record begins as follows.

- 1 John Wolferspargar, Immigrant, m Margaret. No information as to date of his birth. He died about 1761. The burial records in the Shafferstown Pa. cemetery shows that Margaret Wolfesperger was born Sept. 1 1697 d Dec. 1 1775. There is no information that she was the wife of John except the early date of her birth and there seems to be no other place where she would fit in. No record of John's burial has been located.

Among the records of the Department of internal affairs, State House Harrisburg Pennsylvania, is a warrant No. 41 authorizing the survey of 100 acres of land between Cocalico and Muddy Creek amongst several other settlers, for John Wolfespairier, Earl Township, near New Holland for which he agreed to pay the sum of fifteen pounds and ten shillings current money of the Province of Pennsylvania, and the yearly rent of one half penny sterling for every acre thereof. The date of this record was February 20 1734. Under Patent Book A p 33 Dec. 3 1741 it is found that John Wolfespairier did not comply with the terms of the warrant on which the survey was ordered and the survey in his favor became void and the land was warranted to Judiah Malar

for every acre thereof, both to commence with the first day of March 1737. This document was dated April 11 1744 showing that John Wolfesperger had probably been living on the land from March 1 1737. He was no doubt the man referred to as John Wolfespairier and had doubtless abandoned the land surveyed under warrant No. 41.

It is found by reference to Patent Book A. Vol 1. page 540 that John Wolfesperger was granted 671 acres of land under authority contained in the Warrant No. 205 making the usual allowance of 6% for roads and highways. It appears that the grant to this land was never officially confirmed in the name of John Wolfesperger, but after much preamble describing the land etc., the same document we find the following. And whereas the said John Wolfesperger died intestate entitled to the said tract aforesaid, leaving issue, Peter, Frederick, John and Phillip his sons, and Catherine, now wife of Jacob Frey, and Anne Maria now wife of Martin Hefflinger, his daughters who have all humbly besought us to grant to them our patent of confirmation of the said tract of land, now know ye that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and four pounds lawful money of Pennsylvania to our use, paid by the said Peter etc. the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and of the yearly quit rent hereinafter mentioned and reserved we have given, granted and released and confirmed and by these presents for our heirs and successors, do give, grant, release and confirm unto the said Peter, Frederick etc. all that the said hereinbefore described tract of 671 acres of land etc. (Here is a lot of repetition technicalities etc.) to be holden of us our heirs and successors Proprietaries of Pennsylvania of our manor Cosmotege, in the County of Lancaster aforesaid in free and common socage by fealty only in lieu of all other services, yielding and paying therefor yearly unto ~~our~~ heirs and successors at the Town of Lancaster in the said County at or upon the first day of March in every year from the first day of March last, one half penny sterling for every acre of the same or value thereof in coin current according to the exchange, shall then be between our Province and the City of London to such person or persons as shall from time to time be appointed to receive the same, and in case of non-payment thereof within ninety days next after the same shall become due then it shall and may be lawful for us, our heirs and successors, our and their receiver or receivers to enter into and upon the hereby granted land and premises and to hold and possess until the said quit rent and all arrears thereof together with the charges accruing by means of such nonpayment and re-entry be fully paid and discharged.

Witness.- James Hamilton Esq'r, Lieutenant Governor of the said Province who by virtue of certain powers and authorities to him for this purpose granted by the said Proprietaries hath hereunto set their and caused the Great Seal of the Said Province to be hereunto affixed, at Philadelphia this sixth day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and sixty one. The First year of the Reign of King George the Third over Great Brittain Etc., and the forty fourth year of the Provincial Government.

no record discovered to definitely prove this. It is likely that the Wolfenbargers and Freys came to America at the same time, as it is found from the Moravian Records that the Freys came in 1734 and settled in Lancaster Co. Pa. and the Court records show that John Wolfespairier entered land in the same county in that year. It is also evident that the family of the original John, or at least part of them immigrated with him. John our ancestor who settled among the Moravians was born in 1754, and his father, son of John No. 1 was naturalized in Philadelphia on April 11 1744, he being one of the party of forty foreigners who were naturalized at the same time. I have among my files a photostatic copy of the naturalization certificate issued by the judges of the Supreme Court for this group of foreigners. Unfortunately the records at that time did not show on the certificate from what countries these people came, but it is assumed that they were from various countries. Of course it is proven by the certificate that they had all been here at least seven years, and probably some of them very much longer.

Everything indicates that the Wolfenbargers from Alsace probably with the Freys in 1734. They all originally spoke the German language. It will be noted that the name was spelled Wolferspargar in the naturalization certificate.

The records of the Reformed Church at Campbellstown in Lancaster Co. Pa. show that the family was among the pillars of the Church at an early date.

There were many forms of spelling the name in the early days, but the correct name in the German language was probably "Wolfesberger", meaning "The Hill of the Wolves". I have a free hand drawing of the signatures of some members of the family in Shenandoah Co. Va. (On some of the old deeds) and I must admit that after trying decipher the spelling, would not be surprised at any that might be recorded in an American Court, the Clerk not being a German scholar. The children of John Wolfespairier, John Wolferspargar or whatever the name really was, and whom I believe to be one and the same man, are listed as follows.

Wife Elizabeth with whom he had a marriage contract dated March 6 1784 had an agreement with sons George and Peter, oldest son Frederick, son George Michael son John George, daughter Margaret intermarried with Daniel Hemming, and daughter Anna intermarried with John Thomas. It would seem from the above records that Appolonia was the mother of these children and that Peter had to make a marriage contract with Elizabeth before marriage and that he and Elizabeth had to execute certain agreements with the children in connection with the inheritance of the property in which they had an interest through their mother Appolonia. No record is found of John No.4 in Pennsylvania after transaction concerning land formerly belonging to his father, John No. 1. , but reference is found in the History of Shenandoah Co.Va. by John W.Wayland on page 523 where John Wolfenberger (Note they were called Wolfenbergers in Shenandoah Co) with others took oath as Vestrymen in Beckford Parish on March 6 1771. It will be shown later that this John was the father of John who settled in North Carolina and is without _____ doubt the " Man named Wolfesper _____ but is now in Vir-

It should be explained that while the Wolfersbergers were Lutherans and Reformed Church people the office of Vestryman in the Episcopal Church, which was the established Church in Va at that time was frequently conferred upon members of other denominations because there were probably not enough Episcopalians in the Parish to fill the offices of Vestrymen. It is explained by a genealogist that this was often the case, the Luthie an Church being the established Church in Germany or at least the favored church of the governing classes it was most natural to appoint a Lutheran or Reformed as a Vestryman. The Lutheran and Reformed always had joint churches in these parts. Muhlenberg the Lutheran minister at Woodstock where John Wolfenbarger lived was ordained an Episcopal minister in order that he might perform marriages.

John Wolfenbarger purchased land in Shenandoah Co. Va. June 5 1781 Deed Book C. p 433, Deed Book K. p 496 Sept. 29 1785 the following record is found. Peter Wolfenberger and Susan his wife, Frederick and Catherine his wife, Phillipp Wplfenberger and Hannah his wife, Martin Miller and Mary his wife. Joseph Wolfenberger and Nancy his wife, of Shenandoah Co. Va. and JOHN WOLFENBARGER AND CHRISTINA HIS WIFE, of Surry Co. N.C., children and heirs deceased, to Benjamin Wolfenberger of the County of Shenandoah, two lots in the Town of Woodstock of which John Wolfenberger died seized and possessed, known as lots 4 and 76 being the same lots, one half acre each which were conveyed by Nounce Byrd and Clara his wife to Peter Wolfenberger by deed of lease and release may 24 1780. Benjamin Wolfenberger who bought the land from the estate was also one of John's sons and qualified as Administrator of his estate. According to the final settlement filed with the Court Sept. 10 1792, he died about Nov. 18 1788 as in the record of disbursements made is an item paid David Jordan (School Master), six shillings for reading the funeral service. at the burial of the deceased.

His personal property was sold at a sale on May 14 1792 the proceeds of which amounted to 84 pounds and one shilling and 10½ pence. The Administrator's itemized account of disbursements in the settlement of debts and expenses of the estate show that he paid out fourteen shillings and six pence more than the receipts from the sale. John Wolfenberger No. 4 was naturalized Sept. 13 1761 and it is therefore decided that he immigrated to America with his father from Alsace (Where the family probably came from to this Country).

His record carries eligibility to membership in the D.A.R. He was probably too old to fight, but he gave assistance to the Revolution, referred to as follows

5 Philipp Wolfenberger, son of John Wolfenberger No. 1. For identification see same information quoted in case of Peter No. 2. Philipp No. 5 was evidently not married at the time of his father's death since he was the only one of the sons whose wife's name was not mentioned in the land settlements. According to his tomb stone in the Campbellstown Cemetery in Lancaster Co. Pa. he was born 1739 died July 14 1824. According to Reformed baptism records in the History of Shaffersstown his wife was named Margaret, and they had the following children.

A tradition handed down in the family was that John W Sparger (Wolfenbarger) had an uncle Philipp who was body guard for George Washington during his entire career as Commander in Chief of the American Armies. This cannot be verified, however the above is John's Uncle Philipp and the following is found among the Pennsylvania Muster Rolls. Under the general heading " Association of Militia of Lancaster Co. " is found " A Report of the First Battalion Lancaster County Militia commanded by Col. Philipp Greenwalt " In this report of the First Battalion is given the name of First Lieut. Philipp Wolfenbarger in the 8th. Company. This indicates that there must have been something in the tradition which we have been unable to verify. According to the Chronicles of Scotch-Irish settlement in Virginia Court Records of Augusta Co. Va. 1745 to 1800 by Chalkley Vol 2 page 241, Haddington v Stuart, suit over tract of land, Philipp Wolfenbarger deposes and says he lived near the land in 1789. in 1793 he saw James Hudgins cutting stillhouse logs, indicating that Philipp lived in Augusta Co. Va. , however he died in Pennsylvania and was buried there..

6 Catherine Wolfersberger daughter of John Wolfersberger No.1. For identification, see same as Peter No.2. Her marriage to Jacob Frey indicates that the Freys and Wolfenbergers were in close proximity to each other in Pennsylvania or possible in Alsace before they came to America in 1734. It is possible that they were married before they came to this country, as Jacob Frey was naturalized in 1761 at the same time his brother-in-law John Wolfersberger was naturalized. . There is no identification of any children of this couple.

7 Anna Maria Wolfersberger, daughter of John Wolfenberger No. 1 m Martin Heffilfinger. For identification see same as Peter No.2 Martin Heffilfinger was naturalized at the same time as Jacob Frey and John Wolfersberger No.4 were naturalized. There is no identification of any of the children of this marriage.

The son John is to have thirty pounds as his birthwright. The 1600 pounds which the two brothers are to pay is to be divided among my five children, John, Frederick, George, Phillipp and Elizabeth. Exccutors, brother George Wolfersberger, , and Samuel Rex. According to the above he had the following children.

At a Court held in the County of Shenandoah on Thursday the 25 day of September 1788, this receipt of Peter Wolfersberger to Abraham Brubaker and Henry Utt was acknowledged and ordered recorded.

He probably reached the age of 21 in Shenandoah Co. and had to pay poll tax. The records in Greenbrier Co. show that he was also in that County in 1795 where he joined his brothers and sisters in executing a Power of Attorney in favor of his brother Frederick. According to the best information available, he had at least one son. Based on a letter written by Mr. Andrew G. Wolfenbarger of Lincoln Neb., May 25 1910 to Mr. Sam W. Sparger, Mr. A.G. Wolfenbarger's grandfather was Joseph, who as I figure it was this Joseph No. 16. now under discussion. There was a younger Joseph in Greenbrier Co. who was no doubt the son of the original Joseph No. 16, and the father of William W. Wolfenbarger.

She was born in Pennsylvania Nov. 22 1759 and came to North Carolina with her parents when she was six years old in 1765. She died in Surry Co. N.C. between 1830 and 1833. They lived in North Carolina for a while, then in Virginia, and then back in North Carolina. After her death he went to Ohio with his son Henry, in 1833 where he lived until his death in 1840. About the year 1800 he began using the name John W. Sparger in the place of John Wolfenbarger, and of course all of his children adopted the name Sparger, or Spargur as the Ohio branch now spells it. Pages No. 1. to No. 89 inclusive constitute a record of his descendants so far as they have been identified. The record of the descendants of his daughters is very meager as it has been impossible to get satisfactory information concerning them, though there is doubtless a multitude of them.

- 18 Benjamin Wolfenbarger, son of John Wolfenbarger No. 4. For identification see records quoted in case of Peter No. 11. He was probably married twice. The records show that he married Elizabeth Miller in Shenandoah Co. Va. April 1798. She was probably his second wife, since on April 11 1797 Benjamin Wolfenbarger and wife Catherine, sold land on main Street in Woodstock, Shenandoah Co. Va. to Jacob Liggett. Benjamin was appointed Administrator of the estate of his father John Wolfenbarger No. 4 who died in Shenandoah Co. Va. in 1788. The estate was finally settled and reported to the Court, July 7 1792. The real estate belonging to John Wolfenbarger No. 4 was finally bought by Benjamin from his brothers and sisters he paying \$50.00 to each heir. He had a suit against Joseph Yager and his wife as a result of which a certain tract of land was conveyed to Benjamin. This suit was disposed of Oct. 7 1800. He was probably in Greenbrier Co. in 1803, as he and his wife Elizabeth executed a Power of Attorney to Phillip Wolfenbarger to execute a deed. In 1805 he and his wife Elizabeth executed a deed to Henry Pope in Greenbrier Co. On April 8 1806 Benjamin Wolfenbarger and wife of Botetourt Co. Va. sold land in Shenandoah Co. Va. This indicates that they moved to Botetourt Co. in 1805 about the time they sold the land in Greenbrier Co. The

November of that year. He was evidently a wagon maker or "Wheelwright" as his personal property included wagon makers tools, which were bought from the estate by Elizabeth Wolfenbarger (supposedly his widow) at the Administrator's sale. Incidentally Benjamin's father, John Wolfenbarger No.4 was referred to in the records of Pennsylvania as a "Wheelwright" (Maker and repairer of wagons and carts) Many of the family in later generations, have been listed as wagon makers. (Murlin Sparger grandfather of W.H.Creasy the compiler of this record was listed as a wagon maker in the census of 1850, and was noted as being worth over \$2,500.00 at that time)

The records at Wytheville county seat of Wythe County show that Elizabeth Wolfenbarger bought land on Feb'y 22 1827, and no further record of the family is found in that section indicating that they must have moved away from there about that time, though no record was found to show the disposition of the land purchased.

The U.S.Census record shows that in 1828 there was in that County in the town of Evansham (now Wytheville) an Elizabeth Wolfenbarger, with a family of eight supposed to be six sons and two daughters, with herself making nine in all. We have the names of two of the children, taken from a deed from John Short to Elizabeth Wolfenbarger, referred to as daughter of Benjamin Wolfenbarger deceased and witnessed by Samuel Wolfenbarger. Presumably these were both his children.

Benjamin Wolfenbarger was a great-uncle of Murlin Sparger, grandfather of the writer of this record. it is rather evident from tradition that John (or Jack) Sparger, Murlin Sparger's father married in the neighborhood where his Uncle Benjamin lived. He married Sarah Lyon of Hillsville section, and I am told that my Aunt Elizabeth (Lizzie) often visited her relatives in that section in her girlhood. Grandfather Murlin Sparger had a bro. Benjamin who died at the age. of 14.

Wolfenbarger of Perry No. , his great-grand-father was Phillipp Wolfenbarger of Pennsylvania, and his grand-father was Reuben Wolfenbarger of Greenbrier Co.Va. and while there is no definite proof that Phillipp No. 19 is the man referred to taking all things into consideration he seems to be the most logical one to fill this place of the Philipps in this record. We therefore conclude that he had at least one son.

Miles Cary purchased land from William Creasy of St.James Parish, Goochland Co. Va.

Administrator of the estate of Col. William Cole of Warwick Co. Va. 1738. Col. Wilson M. Cary was guardian for William Creasy in Fluvanna Co. Va. in 1787. See will of Judy Creasy Fluvanna Co. Records 1 p 98. Miles Cary and his family are buried in an old country grave yard about three miles north-east of the Court House in Warwick Co. Va. It is thought that these Carys may be related to the Carys of Greenbrier Co., however there is nothing definite to establish this.

It is now thought that Henry Cary who married Hannah Wolfenberger was a son of James and Elizabeth Cary of Halifax Co. Va. In Lunenburg Co. Va., the year that Halifax was cut off of it, it is found that James Cary Jr. was spoken of. This James Cary was a surveyor. James witnessed deeds in Augusta Co., and the Davidson's and Bells came from there and were friends of the Carys. James Cary received land grants in Augusta Co. for Revolutionary service. It is more than probable that further research will clear up any question that Henry Cary's descendants are eligible to DAR membership on James Cary of Halifax Co. Children.

I next find them in the Blue Ridge Mountains of Old Virginia, and my grandfather Joseph Wolfenbarger was born there in the 18th century. My father, William W. Wolfenbarger was born in Pocahontas Co. Va. He was a school teacher, a drover, a merchant and between thirty five and forty years ago was Sheriff of Pocahonta Co. Va. for eight years. He moved to Bath County where I was born at Green Back on the Greenbrier River in 1856. In 1859. my father my father with his family located near Charleston Iowa and lived there to the time of his death in 1867. My mother died at Charleston in 1907. Branches of our family are scattered through Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Kentucky, Illinois Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska and today I am informed that one of the Wardens of the State Penitentiary of Minnessota in recent years was of this name ".

Now a portion of a letter from Mr. J. B. Wolfenbarger of Wolfenbarger and May, Attorneys and Counsellors at Law, Peoria Ill. under date of Dec. 22 1909 is quoted. " My father who is still living, at the age of 75, was born in Pocahontas Co. It will be shown as this record progresses that the Frey family came to America from Alsace in 1734 and settled in Pennsylvania. The earliest mention of the family in North Carolina is found in "Records of Moravians in North Carolina" Vol I. p 270 March 16 1763, copied from the Moravian diaries now on file in the Archives of the Moravian Church at Winston-Salem N.C.

"The Chief Justice and his Company on their way to Salisbury spent the night at Christian Frey's "

Vol I p 276 Nov. 8 1763. Christian Frey's son was bitten on the leg by a poisonous spider. He swelled quickly, to such an extent that he could not see out of his eyes and suffered terribly, and would certainly have died had not Snake Root called Roberts Planting been used in time (This was probably an adopted son since we find elsewhere that Christian Frey had no children)

Vol I p 303, June 11 1765 " Br. Ettwein went to South Fork (Friedberg WMC) to see the Company that arrived yesterday from Pennsylvania. Christian Frey, his parents, his brothers, George and Valentine Frey, the latter's son-in-law Frederick Bockel and their wives and children, some twenty persons in all. Kap a single man was drowned in the Potomac." (Valentine Frey mentioned above was the father of Christina who married John Wolfenbarger)

No attempt has been made to trace Christian Frey's family, but the following is quoted from a letter from Miss Adelaide Fries, Genealogist: " My investigation proved that Christian Frey had no children of his own though he and his wife took care of five or more orphan children. There is a memoir among the Moravian records, which has not been translated, but Miss Fries says that the most interesting statement in it is " He loved and was loved by his friends and acquaintances " From the above it will appear that Christian Frey was the first of the family to settle in North Carolina.

In order that the origin of the records quoted herein may be better understood, the following is quoted from a letter written by Miss Fries Aug. 28 1931 " when I was in Bethlehem some years ago, I looked over some old Church Books, once belonging to a small congregation long since changed or dropped. In one of them I found the early Frey records, going back to Peter, the first immigrant ancestor and copied it thinking I might need it some time" From the above it will be seen that many of the records of the family are really on file at Bethlehem Pa.

- i Peter Frey was born Sept. 27 1689 at Wingen, Alsace, died May 4 1766 at Friedberg N.C. and was the first person buried in the Grave Yard at that point. (I visited his grave Sept. 21 1931 and found the stone and record in good state of preservation WMC) He married Anna Barbara Schmid (This maiden name appears in will of Peter Frey, recorded in Rowan Co. N.C. Book A. p 53), in Alsace in 1716. She was born in Wingen Alsace April 5 1696, died at Bethania N.C. Jan'y 9 1768 and was buried in the Bethania Grave Yard. These names

Some item of interest concerning Peter Frey and his wife are quoted below from " Records of Moravians in North Carolina " Vol I. p 320 Feb'y 17 1766 " Yesterday Br. Ettwein preached in Adam Spach's house, and later read a sermon to those in the home of Christian Frey, for because of the cold the congregation could not all gather at one place. The older Freys (Peter Sr) had been married fifty years, and have nineteen great-grand-children, sixt seven grand-children and twelve children.

Vol I p 320, May 5 1776 " Christian Frey brought the news that his old father went home last evening about eight O'Clock and Br. Graff was asked to hold the funeral service. The next day Br. Graff went to the home of Peter Frey, and there held the funeral of Peter Frey Sr. He was buried in the Grave Yard which has been staked off on the Wachovia Line back of Adam Spach's and the place was consecrated with prayer and address on the text " Except a grain of wheat fall into the ground it bringeth forth no fruit " John 2nd. Chapter and 24 verse. Peter Frey was the first person buried in this grave yard.

Vol. I p 375. Jan'y 31 1768. " Our old mother Frey died suddenly and peacefully. She had been spinning industriously, then she arose from her chair, lay down on the bed and passed away a couple of hours later. She was visiting her daughter Sr. Hege at the time. The funeral was held by Br. Graff " (Her daughter Sr? Hege whom she was visiting at the time of her death was their daughter Juliana, b Feb'y 1735 in Pennsylvania. She married Beltazer Hege and they had the following children, Juliana and Lazarus. WMC)

Vol I p 386 Jan'y 4 1769 " Br. Utley went to South Fork to conduct a funeral service for a child of George Frey the child was buried beside its grandfather in the Grave Yard near the new schoolhouse.

There is no memoir of Peter Frey Sr. on file but the following extended notice is taken from the first Church Register of Friedberg N.C. Peter Frey was the first person buried in the Friedberg Grave Yard.

PETER FREY He was born Sept. 27 1789 in Wingen Alsace, married in 1716, the widow whom he leaves behind, and during his married life, which lasted more than fifty years, he had twelve children by whom he had sixty nine grand-children, twenty great-grand-children. In 1734 he and his wife and seven children moved to Pennsylvania.

In 1745 he was awakened by the testimony of the Brethren concerning the atonement of Jesus, and was received into the little congregation of Muddy Creek Pa. and was admitted to the Holy Communion. When the congregation was disbanded he and his family moved to Heidelberg Pa. and there enjoyed the care of the Brethren. In May 1765, he moved to North Carolina, and built a little house near his son Peter. As long as he was able, he and his wife went to Bethania and partook of the Lord's Supper in the congregation there.

Since last Christmas 1765 he has been confined to his bed, had serious trouble in his chest and longed greatly for release. Three weeks before that came, he

and on the 4th. of May 1766, the Saviour took him to himself. His age was 77 years, 7 months and some days.

On the 6th day of May after a sermon by Br. Graff on the text " Except a corn of wheat fall into the ground and die ", his body was interred, and thereby the burial place, already laid out on the Wachovia line, near South Fork, was consecrated.

There is no separate memoir filed for Anna Barbara Schmid Frey, widow of Peter Frey Sr. but the following rather full notice is given in the Death Record of Bethania. N.C.

Anna Barbara Frey was born April 5 1696 in Wingen Alsace. In her twentieth year, she married Peter Frey. Their union lasted something over fifty years. They had twelve children. and more than one hundred, grand-children and great - grand - children. In 1724 she and her husband and seven children moved to Pennsylvania and settled on Muddy Creek. There she was awakened by the witness of the Brethren concerning the death of Jesus, and when a small congregation was organized she was received and admitted to the Holy Communion. When this little congregation disbanded, she and her husband moved to Heidelberg Pa.; and from there for love of their children they moved to North Carolina in the spring of 1765. In May 1766 she was left a widow. Before Christmas 1767, she came on her last visit, and received much good through the festal and regular services of the congregation. The Saviour granted her desire that she might be spared a long and painful illness, and that she might be taken quickly, which happened on January 9th of this year (1768) in the forenoon. Only a couple of hours previously she had been spinning, when she was taken with a severe chill and great pain in the chest. The last verse she had been singing was.

" I am melted into tears
When I sing of Jesus' death "

Her age was 71 years, 9 months and 4 days.

bara Meyer - widow, daughter of Peter Binckelè, who was born in Whitsuntide 1722, d Jan'y 6 1791 at Hope N.C.

The following quotations from Records of Moravians in North Carolina will be of interest in connection with the record of Valentine Frey. The first mention of him in North Carolina is his arrival at South Fork June 10 1765 with his brothers and father and mother, from Pennsylvania.

Vol 1 p 352 Feb'y 6 1767. Six of the settlers of the Ens. , Adam Spach, Peter Christian, George, and Valentine Frey and Frederick Boekel, waived property rights to the house to be erected on the lot between their settlement and the South line of Wachovia and staked off the site for the log house 34 by 28 feet. The object of this building was the preaching of the gospel and a school house for the children. A prayer commended the building and all those who should work on it to the care of the Lord, and then the sills were laid.

Vol I p 376. Christian Frey's house below the Ens., and Valentine Frey's house in the Muddy Creek settlement, near Douthitt's were used as preaching places once a month in 1768.

Vol. I p 386 Jan'y 14 1769. Br. Utley preached in Valentine Frey's house in English, and on the 15th. to the Company beyond the Ens. .

Vol I p 404. In 1770 Valentine Frey and John Douthed have run a new road from their settlement toward Salem as far as the Salisbury Road. (Dalem was established in 1766 WMC)

Vol II p 792 and 793 in Sept. 1771 , Rev Geo Soelle starts on an itinery of preaching to various congregations. He mentions visiting Valentine Frey who lives West of Muddy Creek, and whose location can be found on the map of Wachovia of that time. Vol. I p 310 ; Soelle remarks in his diary that he knew the Freys fourteen years earlier in Pennsylvania; also notes that so may people stop at Frey's, that he feels sorry for the two old people

Vol I p 1026. It was contray to the Moravian calling to mix in political affairs or to bear Arms.

Vol III p 1030 . The Provincial Congress that met in Halifax N.C. in 1776 passed an Act concerning the Brethren " That as they did not bear arms, their guns should be taken, but politely and that an appraised value should be placed upon them, and that they themselves should not be forced to serve

Vol III p 1110. Feb'y 23 1776. Valentine Frey with others signed the test oath of allegience to the Colonies, gave his arms and refreshed Capt. Fornes and his Company with food and drink. (This act alone entitles his descendents to membership in DAR. Mrs. C.B.Clegg of Greensboro N.C. used this as one of the Services of her ancestor and was accepted. See Nation- No. 287625.

pp 152 - 153 - 154, records of the affirmation of allegiance and Fidelity to be taken by the United Fratrum or Moravians, and granting them indulgences there-in and other purposes.

OATH OF ALLEGIENCE

I A.B. do solemnly and sincerely declare and affirm in the presence of Almighty God, that I will truly and faithfully demean myself as a peaceful subject of the Independent State of North Carolina and will be subject to the powers and authorities that are or may be established for the good government thereof, and not inconsistent with the Constitution, by yielding either an active or passive obedience thereto; and that I will not abet or join the subjects or forces of the King of Great Britain or other enemies of this state, by any means, or the United States of America, and that I will make known to the Governor or some member of the Council of State, Judge of the Supreme Court, or Justice of the Peace, all treason, conspirators or attempts, committed or intended against the same which shall come to my knowledge.

The following records do not refer particularly to Valentine Frey, but comments made by Dr. Clewell in his History of Wachovia on the pages quoted above seem appropriate at this point to give an insight into the lives and habits of those old Moravians during the period covered by these records

In February 1779, Justice Dodson met the men of the several towns and they gathered into the Church, forming a half circle about the Magistrate, the latter read the form of affirmation, the men repeated it after him. At the end of the formula, Dodson said " So help me God " He then gave each one a written certificate. This closed forever the question of liberty in the matter of affirming. They were likewise relieved of the further anxiety regarding military duty by the imposition of a triple tax. This tax was paid until 1783.

WACHOVIA DURING THE REVOLUTION
Same History p 122.

When we study this portion of the History of Wachovia, we must never doubt the patriotism of these people. They would not become soldiers, but they supported the Government, by equally valuable methods. A strong example of their loyalty is shown by the action taken in Aug. 1776. Previous to that time the Church Litany was the same used by the Moravian Church in England. On August 6 they received news from Philadelphia, a Declaration of Independence had been made. Three days later they sent notice to each church. in the Province that they should discontinue the prayer " For His Majesty the King George III, and replace this petition with the one for the Authorities of our land who have rule over us "

To fully appreciate the situation we should understand who were their enemies and who were their friends.

Their enemies were divided into four classes. First the deparadoes who always flourish in times of confusion. Second, a class of envious, shiftless people who

a number of " hot heads " who laid stress on some fancied personal wrong, for example, refusal of store or hotel to receive a double piece of money. Fourth, honest men who misunderstood them because because of lack of information. This class of enemies frequently became their warmest friends.

Those who were friendly to the Moravians are divided into three classes.

First: - those who represented them in the Legislature and in Congress or in the Courts. Such men as Armstrong, Williams and others. Their friendship and support never wavered for an hour. Second: the officials who studied them and their actions. Among them we mention the Committee of Safety and the Legiskature, after its meeting in Salem. Third :- The Army officers. We have record of friendly visits from Washington, Cornwallis, Tryon, Waddell, Rutherford and others.

When we contemplate the situation of Bethabra, surrounded by large bands of hostile Indians in 1759, we recognize the Divine protection, the only power that could save them from destruction (Bethabra was the first Moravia settlement in North Carolina WMC.)

The study of the time of the Revolution calls forth the same acknowledgement of Special Divine guidance, for during these years they were threatened with every form of danger from the vicious prowler to the great armies Greene and Cornwallis, from the petty envy of County Magistrates, to the animosity of the full meeting of the Legislature in 1778.

In the end they were successful in carrying out their honest plans. They had pure religion, they cared for education, they were honest and thrifty, they lived in the midst of the world but were not of the world. They understood men and things but were themselves not understood. They had burdens placed upon them that would have crushed almost any other colony. They were beset with dangers which often made them feel that sudden destruction was sweeping down upon them yet they were always mercifully preserved."

Dr. J. H. Clewell, the author of the History of Wachovia from which the above quotations are taken was a Moravian preacher of more recent times, and was for many years President of the Salem Female Academy, and was personally known to the writer of the Frey Family record, two of the writer's sisters having been students in this school many years ago, under Doctor Clewell's administration.

The above is another item of service cited by Mrs. C. B. Clegg of Greensboro N. C. in her application for membership in DAR, National Number 287625.

These accounts are copied here because of their

bearing on the various Companies and officers mentioned in Moravian Diaries in connection with the expedition against the Tories which ended with the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge, Feb'y 27 1776 and to show that the descendants of Valentine Frey and his father-in-law Peter Binckele (Sometimes spelled Pinkley) are entitled to membership in the DAR or SAR, as the above paragraphs show that while exempted from bearing arms by the laws of the Colony, because of their religious faith, yet not only were they friendly to the cause of the Patriots, but gave aid and assistance.

Some further records from the Moravian Diaries are copied below, not because they refer to Valentine Frey, but on account of their connection with John Wolfenbarger who married Valnetine Frey's daughter, Christina.

Vol III p 1080 Dec. 9 1776.

A man by the name of Wolfesperger who formerly lived near Lititz Pa. but is now in Virginia, made an agreement with Br. Graff to buy 300 acres on Spark's Creek. His son will settke there. "(The man named Wolfesper has been definitely identified as John Wolfenbarger of Woodstock, Shenandoah Co. Va. who died there in 1788, and his son was to settle on Spark's Creek, being John Wolfenbarger who married Christina Frey. about 1800 he changed the name to Sohn W. Sparger .WMC)

Vol IV. April 26 1777.

At nine O'Clock in the evening my wife heard a shot toward Christian Frey's. I did not notice and while it frightened me we heard no more, so we went to bed commending ourselves to the care of God.

April 28 1777

We went to Christian Frey's and they told us what danger they had been in. Four rascals had broken into their house, and behaved in a murderous fashion, and if their dear Saviour had not protected them their lives would not have been safe. The men had called at the door, and when John Wolfesberger went out to them they asked if stangers were there. When he said no, they seized him but he jerked loose from them and went into the house. When Christian spoke to them gently, one of them hit him on the head, another struck Sarah across the shoulder with the flat of his sword. With a large stone, they broke the paneling out of the cupboard and with a sword cut the wood around the locks, taking all the money and whatever else they wished. After Christian had received another cut on the head he tried to get out of the house, but was given a blow on the chest with a gun by the guard at the door, so that he became faint. Finally he escaped from them and raised an alarm, when they fired after him, but God so ordered it that he was not hit. Poor Sarah who had hidden behind the door sank to her knees when she heard the shot, and when the rascals had left, she was very happy to find her husband still living (It would be interesting to know where John Wolfesberger was all this time WMC)

The widowed brother, Valentine Frey who fell Blessedly asleep in Hope N.C. Sept. 13 1798 was born on May 9 1721 at Wigger in the Palatinate, and was brought up in the Lutheran faith.

His childhood passed according to his own confession without much thought about himself or the salvation of his soul.

In his thirteenth year his parents and their children moved to America, settled first on the Canswege in the State of Pennsylvania. About this time the spirit of God began to work mightily in his heart; he did not understand what was happening, yet nevertheless he lived an honorable Christian life, attended preaching frequently and once took Communion in the Lutheran Church.

Somewhat later he moved with his parents to Muddy Creek where he first learned to know the Brethren, who were beginning a Society there. The substance of the address made by their preaching and other services brought good to his disturbed heart, so he decided to unite himself with their Society.

About this time he married the widow Barbara Meyer, maiden name Binckele with whom he had thirteen children from whom he has lived to see 102 grand-children 49 graet-grand-children. She died peacefully in 1791.

At the place of their residence the organization of the congregation of the Brethren failed to materialize so in the course of time they moved to Heidelberg Pa. and as he had already been received into the Unity, he partook for the first time of the Holy Communion with the Heidelberg Congregation.

In June 1764 his parents and brothers moved to North Carolina and he came with them, attending the Holy Communion at Bethabra until the Congregation at Friedberg was organized, when he became one of its first members.

In the course of some years he moved to the neighborhood of Hope. During this period he turned into various by-paths which interrupted his fellowship with us. Although under these circumstances he was often reminded of what he had formerly felt in his heart, and although he often attended our meetings, yet he did not experience the desired change of heart until finally the Saviour brought him to a knowledge of himself, melted his heart and led him to realize that he was a poor sinner (A Methodist backslider WMC) He at once related his experience, testifying that he had received grace and forgiveness of his sins through the Saviour, and now earnestly wished again to partake of the Holy Communion with the congregation, which request was granted. When in later days he spoke of this time he wept bitter tears, saying " Oh " how faithfully the Saviour has dealt with me and how he has gone with me all the way "

In the course of time he returned to Friedberg, but in 1794 went back to Hope, to the home of one of his daughters, who cared for him faithfully to the end of which he spoke with gratitude.

We can bear witness of him that he, especially in the later years of his life stood in close communion

with the Saviour. He was not easily prevented from attending Sunday services, although on account of his age it was often hard for him to come. Sometime he benoaned his outward circumstances and regretted that there was no one near him who felt as he did, but usually ended by saying " Why should I complain ? I have something that I once did not have; my saviour is my best friend, to him I tell all my circumstances, and Oh' that refreshes and comforts me indescribably "

The salvation of his children lay close to his heart, and he affirmed that he prayed constantly for them to the Saviour. He often spoke with much regret that his children did not belong to the Brethren's Church which he liked so much " Some " he said are too far away and others who live near by have neglected it " .

The Holy Communion was for him true sustenance, and a strengthening for his soul. Each time, his preceding declaration concerning his need of the grace which the Saviour showed to his heart was edifying. On one occasion as he lay on his death bed he said " Oh' the Holy Communion is a great thing, he who has once partaken of it with the Brethren, has something which he can never loose, even if he wanders from the path, and it brings him back. I have myself experienced that " .

On the 2nd of this month (September) he was here in the meetinghouse for the funeral of a single woman, Sarah Taylor, but he was already so weak that he could not go to the grave yard and remarked to several Brethren " I shall be the next " On reaching home he was obliged to go to bed. Each visit found him in a blessed condition of faith " The Saviour is near me " he said " I do not know whether this is the end or not, but if it is His will I am ready and glad ", and he testified that nothing hindered him from appearing joyfully before the Saviour. When verses were sung for him, he said several times that they expressed the feelings of his heart and joined in singing them.

Having brought of of his material affairs into order he waited in quiet confidence for his last hour, which came in the evening of the 13th of this month and he softly and blessedly fell asleep/his age being 77 years four months and four days.

MEMOIR TO ANNA BARBARA FREY
MAIDEN NAME BINCKELE, WIFE OF
VALENTINE FREY..

Anna Maria Barbara Frey, d Jan'y 6 1791 in the evening in the sixth hour and was buried on the 8th of that month in our God's Acre. She was born June 1 1722 in Alsace, and came with her parents to America. In her 17th year she married her first husband Matthias Meyer with whom she lived in Germantown Pa. and the had two daughters. In the third year of her marriage she was left a widow.

After some time she married the present widower Valentine Frey. They were both awakened through the preaching of the Brethren and were members of the country congregation o Heidelberg, Pa. and partook for the first time of the Holy Communion in 1756. In 1755

They belonged to the country congregation of Friedberg. When she became very feeble they transferred their membership to Hope. Fourteen days before the end she had herself brought hither (Salem) in order to be better served by the doctor. At first she improved, but on the above mentioned day she fell softly asleep from a stroke.

From the last marriage she was blessed with thirteen children. She lived to see about 100 grandchildren and nine great-grand-children. Her age was sixty eight years and seven months (Translated from the first burial Register of Salem Church)

He married (2) in . . . 1749 Maria Margaretha, maiden name Geiger (Widow Schmell) They had nine children. The death notice adds that the names of many of the children are no known and dates of births are not available, so no list of them is given.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS OF NORTH CAROLINA

Wagon in the Cross Creek Expedition as a baggage
and provision wagon for the Militia of Surry Co.
22 days 16:10.0

Peter Binckele set out to day for the second time for the South, taking baggage for the Militia there. He came here 14 days ago, there was only one man with him and we hear that there should have been thirty, who were left from the last draft.

MEMOIR OF PETER BINCKELE

He was born March 2 1704 in the village of Guckens-
burg in Canton Bern Switzerland. His parents were Chris-
tian and Elizabeth Binckele, maiden name Berg. In his
ninth year his father passed out of Timen account of
their poverty our departed brother had been obliged
to seek support from outsiders already in his sixth year
In his thirteenth year his mother moved into Alsace, and
the following year his brother came for him, and he lived
with him for three years, herding cattke, then he served
another farmer for two years. The latter advised him to
learn the trade of shoemaker; he had been in that work
only fourteen days when he engaged himself for two years
to an inn-keeper as a driver. The large size of the
farm and the many opportunities for doing evil led him
to concern about the salavation of his soul. In order
to get away from that he married Anna Maria Werley, and
remained in the neighborhood, taht is in the Steinthan
Didtrict for twelve years, supporting his family by cut-
ting wood in the forest and burning charcoal. In the
eighth year after his marriage, he and another man with
whom he was cutting grass, were struck by lightening as
they had taken shelter under a Beach tree from the rain,
and he was so badly burned that for several weeks he was
confined to his bed. This occurrence delayed for four
years his going to America, but meanwhile he associated
himself with the awakened people of the neighborhood.
In the year 1736 he and several other awakened fami-
lies emigrated to America, reaching Philadelphia toward
the end of September, the same fall he went to Warwick,
(Later Lititz) Pa. and remained there for two years.
From there he moved to Catores, nine miles above York-
town (Later York) Pa. Here he associated with the
Separatists, and heard for the first time of the pious
Count Zinzendorf, who however had already returned to
Europe. Soon after, for the first time he heard a Broth-
er give free witness of the full atonement of sin made
by Jesus, which was very comforting to our departed Bro-
ther who hitherto had not listened with open ears and
heart to the doctrine of the suffering and death of Jesus
which alone could make men holy. He quietly sought ev-
ery opportunity to attend the services of the Brethren,
where he frequently heard Br. Spangenberg preach whereby
he received some blessing. In 1748 his wife died after

name Geiger, and in this second marriage, God gave him nine children, of whom six are still living. In the year 1750 he was received into the Unity, and in 1752 attended the Holy Communion for the first time. In 1763 he moved to Mankosy Md. to be nearer a school-house, but as there he could get only one hundred acres of land, and had no water, he sold that farm in 1772 and moved to Wachovia N.C. and established himself there, three miles from Bethania. So far his own story.

From his life here it can be said, according to his own testimony, that he loved the Saviour, and in spite of failings and errors, it was his intention to rejoice His heart. That his joy was in the Word of God and in the service of the Church was manifest, for hwn because of advanced age he could no longer ride a horse he constantly walked the three miles from his home in order to attend the services. In the midst of all the difficulties which surrounded him he permitted nothing to disturb his association with the congregation and often said that the Saviour was his One and All. His only comfort and support and how he constantly longed to be at Home with Him. All who knew him honored him as an upright and peace-loving man. As late as the 11th of the month he came to the service, and as usual he was happy and affectionate. The same evening he had a hard fall which apparently revived an injury which he had received in a fall last spring and from which he seemed to have recovered. The same evening he must go to bed, and it soon became evident that this was to be the cause of his release. The pain which he suffered was much increased by a severe cough, yet he was bright and content when the blessedness of being with Jesus was pointed out to him. He said that he did not know what the plan of the Saviour was, but that he was entirely ready to submit to his will, and that he could gladly say that nothing disturbed his mind. On the day before his home-going he was visited by several Brethren from here, he was quite cheerful and affectionate and appeared much pleased by the verses sung to him, during which he folded his hands together. He remained conscious to the end, and passed away gently and peacefully toward rhe evening of the 20 of the month. His age was 89 years, five months and 18 days He is now in peace. Of his twenty three children by his first and second marriages, eleven are still living. He left 62 grandchildren and 56 great grandchildren, so that as far as we can learn the entire number of his still living children and children's children is 129.
