The Association Reorganizes

Jones, Wolfenbarger, Liddell and Spargur In New WFA Posts

Now in its third year, the Wolfensberger Family Association revised its organization structure in April to deepen and strengthen its leadership.

In a move to guarantee the WFA's continuity in the event of incapacity, the association's Board of Directors voted April 26 to restructure the organization by changing the title of the organization's Executive Director to President and creating three new officers. All positions are unpaid. The changes took effect immediately.

Second Vice President is Myrna Liddell of Langley, Washington. Mrs. Liddell was a founding director of the association and is currently engaged in translating the German-language history of the Wolfensberger family. She is the daughter of Wilma Opal Wolfinbarger.

The new Secretary of the Association is William (Bill) F. Spargur of Palmdale, California He is a retired military officer and was elected a Director in 1997.



How the Swiss See The Wolfensberger Family: 700 Years of Contributions to Zurich Canton

This article is adapted from a translation of a German-language history describing the origins of many prominent families in the Zurich Canton of Switzerland. The history, "66 Familiennamen seit 700 Jahren in the Districts of Bachtel, Stoffel and Schnebelhorn", was published in 1996 in Switzerland.

We are indebted to Monique
Wolfensberger-Coppens for her English
translation of this history. She is the
daughter-in-law of WFA member Max
Wolfensberger of Stafa, on
Switzerland's scenic Lake Zurich.

The Wolfensbergers of Bauma

The Wolfensberger family originated in a mountaintop farm, the Hof Wolfensberger, located in Switzerland's northeast border region, an area known today as the Zuercher Oberland. The region is part of the districts of Bauma and Baretswil in the canton of Zurich. The family's name is derived from the Wolfensberg, a low Alpine mountain just outside Bauma, where wild wolves once roamed. (Except in specific instances, we shall use the Wolfensberger family name.)

In this region of medieval Europe, the border area has been long associated with fierce wolves and bears. Opposite the Wolfensberg, across the Toss Valley and directly below the Hornli, Zurich Canton's highest mountain lies a Bear Valley and a Bear Woods.

Based upon archeological discoveries by the late Jakob Wolfensberger, father of WFA honorary director Heini Wolfensberger, the Toss Valley has been settled for at least 4,000 years.

There is no record of when the last wolf was driven out of the region, but legend tells us that the last bear was slain on the Homli in 1532 by three monks from the nearby Ruti monastery, a cloistered sanctuary with a long association with the Wolfensberger family.

The story is told that the trio of monks was summoned to the scene by a crowd of terror-stricken local farmers. One monk poked at the giant bear with a homernade spear, but the bear snapped the lance in two with one mighty swipe of its paw. After a grueling battle, another monk, aided by farmers and their dogs, finally succeeded in stabbing the bear in the throat. The body of the vanquished bear — last of his kind from Hornli — was formally presented to Zurich's parliament.

Wolver of course, were a common scourge in nodieval Switzerland. In 1377, so many wolves were sighted in the region that Zurich was forced to close the gates to the fortress. Again in 1594, wolves were reported to have attacked many children in the Zurich area. As late as the 17th Century, wolf hunts were a favorite form of entertainment for local Swiss gentry.

A Distinguished Nobleman

History's first Wolfensberger was a knight named Baldebert (known in this account as Baldebrecht), who enters history in 1233 as a distinguished nobleman. According to legend, he apparently earned his knighthood for bravery in a Crusade to save the Holy

Land. The only Crusade in Baldebert's lifetime was the Seventh Crusade, an ill-starred religious march to save Palestine that ended in failure. A patron of the Ruti monastery, he is buried near the cloistered monastery on the River Jona.

As late as the Fourteenth Century, there were at least two established peasant villages on the Wolfensberg slopes. Atop the mountain, the knights of the Wolfensberg, then subjects of the Counts of Rapperswil, maintained a mountaintop castle or tower for a significant period of time in the Middle Ages. The medieval castle, Altlandenberg, is shown as a ruins in a 1560 map of the region, one of several atop peaks in the region. (There's no trace of Altlandenberg's ruins today, although its site has been discovered.)

Battled The Swiss

Less than a century later, another prominent Wolfensberger knight enters history. In battle against the Swiss, Hermann Wolfensberger of Morgarten, is killed in battle on November 16, 1315. Serving Herzog (king) Leopold of Austria, Hermann is killed fighting on the side of the Austrians against the Swiss. A year later, his widow, Dorethea von Wolfensberg, remarries, this time to an Austrian. But the region eventually becomes uncontested Swiss territory.

In 1392, Herman von Hinwil, then a judge in nearby Greifenburg, apparently sold his interest in the mountaintop castle, the Wolfensberger family home



then known as the Hof zu
Oberwofisperg, for a yearly cash
payment and annual payments in grain
and oats.

The family castle ultimately fell into the hands of the Ruti monastery in the early 15th Century. In 1432, the Hof Wolfensberg (another variation of the name) is leased to a Konrad Senn. By 1439, the Wolfensberger association with the castle ends, as does its ties with the Ruti monastery. By then the castle may have become uninhabitable ruin, since it is pictured as a ruin in 1560.

Prominent Cantonal Family

The family, however, remained a prominent ZurichCcanton family. A Hans Wolfensberger, a weaver and holder of the intriguing titles of Bosshart of Hornen and Meyer of Bliggenswil, formally becomes a citizen of Zurich in 1446. During the Fifteenth Century's Old Zurich War, canton officials apparently went about the border region offering citizenship to affluent citizens to help finance the canton's defense.

By the end of the Fifteenth Century, the hegemony of the powerful Counts of Rapperswil ends. However, the Wolfensberger family name lives on in a variety of forms. In 1463, records show that a noble-sounding Uli von Wolfysperg zu Wallenwil and Hans Wolfysperg zu Ettenhausen paid land and personal taxes, suggesting the family was no longer regarded as local nobility. Even so, Herman von Wolfensperg, his wife and a maiden named Verena are mentioned in local history just a few years later.

As the 16th Century approached, the Wolfensberger clan could be found living on in the Wolfensberg, in Allenwil and Ettenhausen. Ruodi Woffisberg, a family member and descendant of the Wolfensberger soldiers, is listed as a property owner in Rapperswill.

In addition to these family members, records in the Ettenhausen-Wetzikon district list a number of prominent Wolfensbergers over a period of years. In 1540, for example, Benhart Wolfensberger lived in Ettenhausen.

In 1615, Hans Wolfensberger became a Bannwart, a local government official. Johannes Wolfensberger of Pfaffikon, who is listed as a minister in 1565, dies three years later in an outbreak of the plague.

End of Thirty Years War

By the end of the Thirty Years War in 1650, Wolfensbergers are counted as citizens in many Canton Zurich villages. In addition to the villages above, the name appears often in the districts of Bauma, Baretswil, Wetzikon, Hinwil, Gossau and Staefa.

In a later generation, a Hans Wolfensberger (1742-1818) enters history as a prominent cantonal official. In 1770, Hans bought a large estate on the shore of Lake Zurich and built a house and winery there.

He subsequently became a cantonal judge and president. His son, Hans II, also served as judge, president as well as a member of the cantonal parliament.

In the 19th Century, the family name is found in at least 13 villages in the District of Bauma.
