



Feeling Safe On The Frontier: All it Took Was Two Rifles, An Axe, A Knife and A Dog

And you thought being alone at night was scary!

Life was tougher for our ancestors. Here's one to remember.

Joseph W. Sparger, Sr. the third of nine children of John Wolfersberger Sparger and Christina Frey. Joseph was born March 1,1781, in Surrey County, NC and died March 6,1845 in Highland County, Ohio.

Joseph's first marriage was to Rachel Sumner in May 1801. She died in 1823. Joseph and Rachel had 10 children, all of whom were born in Highland County.

Joseph's second marriage was to Abigail Moore on December 26, 1823, in Highland County, Joseph and Abigail had eight children, all born in Highland County. At birth, Joseph spelled his name Sparger. In Ohio, he changed the spelling to Spargur as did the rest of the Highland County family.

WFA member David J.

Dalton of Ghanna. OH, recently sent an e-mail message containing a passage that he found on page 93 from a 1890 edition of "A History of the Early Settlement of Highland County, Ohio" by Daniel Scott. It reads as follows::

"Joseph W. Spargur
emigrated from Surry County,
North Carolina, in the fall of 1804,
and settled in Highland County on
the farm known as the Odell place,
southwest of the present town of
New Petersburg.

"Mr. Spargur was a millwright

by trade and pursued his profession whenever he could find employment. Game was plentiful in the vicinity and Indians were seen more frequently than whites. Indians passed by almost daily, either singly or in small parties.

"Since Rachel Spargur knew almost nothing about Indians except the stories she heard about their savage and bloodthirsty nature, it was expected that she would be very fearful in her husband's absence. In fact, she was.

"When Joseph was late coming home from work, Rachel barricaded herself in the cabin, arming herself with two loaded rifles, an axe, a butcher knife and a dog. Only then did she feel secure enough to sleep."

Larry Jones recalls, "I tried to contact Dr. Bell for several years, but all of my efforts were in vain. Recently, we placed a Wolfensberger Family Association advertisement in Everton's Genealogical Helper, an important genealogical reference publication.

"I felt that was our lucky day. That day we located a person who has done so much to tell the story of our early family in Europe and in America.

John Emmett was the son of John Peter Wolfenbarger and Alice Taiclet. genealogical work entitled "Sparger and Allied Families" compiled and published by W. M. Creasy (my great uncle) and James Bingman Sparger that was completed in the mid-1930s.


William Murlin Creasy, Sr. was born September 14, 1868 in Surry County, North Carolina, the oldest of seven children seven children of the Reverend Walter Scott Creasy and Edith Eliza Sparger.

He was reared in Patrick County, Virginia, but much of his adult life in Wilmington, North Carolina. William was an active member of Grace Methodist Church (which had been founded by his father in 1887) and was a member of the board of Stewards.

Joined railroad in 1889

William's first job was in the accounting department of the Atlantic Coast Line railroad Company in Wilmington. He joined the railroad on February 4, 1889, and eventually rose to the position of Supervisor of Joint Facility Accounts.

He married Gertrude Medernach Bagby in 1901, and they were the parents of William Murlin Creasy, Jr. and Helen Dunn Creasy Hunter (now both



deceased). The Creasys built a neat two story frame house at 805 Ann Street in Wilmington in 1906. Recently that house underwent extensive restoration and was awarded a plaque citing it as a part of Historic Wilmington.

In addition to the Sparger history, W. M. Creasy also compiled a "Creasy Family History' which traces that family back to the immigrant ancestor John Creasy (Henrico County, Virginia) in the mid-1600s.

The North Carolina Archives in Raleigh has copies of both histories. I am presently working to republish both histories updated with information collected over the years.

W. M. Creasy died March 27, 1939, and his wife Gertrude died January 31, 1945. Both are buried in Elmwood Cemetery, Charlotte, North Carolina.


