## A Letter to the Members

Your Wolfensberger Family Association, one of a growing number of family organizations created by history-minded clan members in the United States, has taken another step toward maturity.

Founded six years ago by Larry Jones of Oklahoma City, it brought together members of the Spargur, Sparger, Wolfenbarger, Wolfenbarger, Wolfenberger and Wolfensberger families who sought to learn about their rich history.

Although founded in the U.S., it now boasts members in Switzerland, the U.S., and several other countries who trace their ancestry back to the 14<sup>th</sup> Century and an Austrian Emperor who conferred knighthood on a family member in the 1300s.

Over the centuries, the Wolfensberger family has migrated from its roots in northern Zurich Canton, not far from the bustling financial center of Zurich, to neighboring countries, to the United States, and to many other countries around the world.

To one who believed the family was once small and isolated, I learned that the Wolfenbarger name - the most common in the clan - is listed as one of the U.S. Census Bureau's most common surnames.

Growing up in Florida, I believed that the family was originally German, as its name

## New WFA Officers for year 2001

With the resignation of Larry Jones after six years at the head of the Wolfensberger Family Association, the WFA's Board of Directors elected a new president, Bob Wolfenbarger of Summit, N. J., and a new officer team.

Bob had been the board's First Vice President for several years. He is recognized by the family's genealogists as the family member who first discovered the Wolfensberger clan's Swiss roots, when he helped make connections with the Swiss family in 1962, while serving in the U.S. Army in Germany.

Jones resigned from the WFA presidency earlier this year, but remained in place to serve during the transition to a new president. In the new Board of Directors, elected to serve during 2001, Jones will become the WFA membership chairman and archivist, a new Board position. He is a member of the Wolfenbarger family.

#### **OBITUARIES**

Norma Ruth ROADS Tiedt of Dayton, Ohio died 31 January 1999 and was buried in the Miami Valley Memorial Gardens near Dayton, OH next to her late husband. She was born 13 November 1912 near New Vienna, OH, a twin of Erma Ann ROADS and the daughter of Sterling L. ROADS and Edith T. MEDSKER. Sterling was the son of Noah ROADS, the son of Daniel ROADS born 1814 and Maletha W. SPARGUR. At an early age Norma and her twin sister became skilled violinists. Her brother Paul remembers during evenings taking turns in turning the cream separator while listening to the violins. He thought heaven could not be any better than life on the farm and listening to the violins.

Norma attended an Office Training School in Columbus, OH and later worked at Rikes Department Store in Dayton. She later worked at Wright Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton from 1940 to 1994. She married Robert TIEDT of Dayton on 13 November 1939.

Her parents and most of her sisters and brothers preceded her in death. Survivors include her brothers Noah ROADS of Houston, TX and Paul C. ROADS of Lafayette, CO. Norma and her brothers and sisters helped heroically in the war effort during World War II and received many medals and awards for their efforts. (Norma's brother Paul C. Jerry D. WOLFENBARGER age 65 of Austin, Texas passed away at his home on 17 August 2000, after a lengthy illness. Jerry was born 11 September 1943 near Neosho, MO. He served his country in the U. S. Frank was a very highly respected man. Many of the businesses in Bastrop, a town of 3,500, shut down during the funeral. The house where Frank was born is still standing about a quarter mile from the Wolfenberger Cemetery. Frank's wife Annie died 4 October 1999. They are buried side by side in the Bastrop Cemetery. To the marriage of Frank and Annie was born a daughter Frances Ann. Frances and husband, Robert MOORE, live in Bastrop, TX. Frank was the son of George Gladden WOLFENBERGER and Estelle Minnie TITTLE. George was the son of Charles WOLFENBERGER and Mary LITTON. Charles was the son of Samuel WOLFENBERGER and Caroline FLESHEART. Samuel was born in 1802 in Wythe County, VA, the son of Benjamin WOLFENBARGER

President's Letter (cont. from page 1) appears to most Americans. Only after I lived in Germany and grew acquainted with a genealogist 35 years ago did I discover that our roots lay in northern Switzerland. With the dramatic growth of interest in family genealogy in recent years, many family members wished there was some sort of organization to bind all the clans of the Wolfensberger family together under a single name.

I'm proud that Larry Jones, who found my name in a family history, got in touch with me and others to see if there was a common interest in an organization that would bring us in touch with our rich history and genealogy.

There clearly was. And there clearly is. It is in the membership of the Wolfensberger Family Association. Like most other Association members, I am not a genealogist by training or interest. Instead, I was always interested in my family's history. By tapping into our history, I found out who we were. And I found out who I was.

Over the past six years we discovered some remarkable ancestors in the stories contained in our newsletter. We found Revolutionary Army officers, soldiers in the French and Indian War and the War of 1812. We found generals and cabinet officials, Hall of Fame baseball heroes and professional football stars. We also found teachers, artists, writers, storekeepers and policemen as well as other public-spirited civil servants. Our families moved across America, taming the frontier. Few made the pages of history, but we made history. In short, we found a cross-section of America in our family.

Now we're able to learn about our Swiss ancestors, whose history and productivity were little different than their American relatives. The American branch of the family didn't know about our Swiss forbears until the middle of this century. Through this association and by way of this newsletter, we will learn more about them. In the process, we may become closer as members of a united family.

The Swiss family will be proud of their American relatives just as we are proud of our Swiss relatives, who've helped make our homeland a proud, independent nation. Respectfully,

Jones led the formation of the family association and served as its first president for six years. During his term, Jones helped create the WFA newsletter, build roles for the Board of Directors, attract a host of new members, and generally strengthen the family association. He was instrumental in designing and erecting a memorial monument to the clan's "First Family", John and Margaretha Wolfensberger, in Schafferstown, Penn.

With Jones' resignation, the Board elected an entirely new officer slate during its October 14 meeting, bringing a set of new faces and familiar ones into new positions.

The 2001 slate of officers is drawn from the Sparger, Spargur, Wolfenbarger and Wolfinbarger families.

Elected WFA Vice President (the second-ranked officer position) is Mrs. Myrna Liddell, a member of the Wolfinbarger family, of Whidby, Wash. Myrna is completing an English-language translation of the family's earliest published history, printed over 70 years ago in Switzerland.

Reelected Secretary of the organization is Bill Spargur of Palmdale, Calif. A retired military officer, Bill serves as a deputy sheriff in Los Angeles County, California The association created a new Board position for the editor and publisher of the Wolfensberger Family Association newsletter. Replacing Bob Wolfenbarger of New Jersey as newsletter editor is Richard "Buzz" Evans of Houston, Tex. He is a member of the Sparger family. The Board also created the position of Finance Officer to manage the organization's finances. Al Creasy, a member of the Sparger family, of Tryon, N.C., was elected to the position. In addition, the Board created a new position as the organization's Finance Auditor, to help audit the association's finances. Elected was a certified public auditor, W. Frank Wolfenbarger of Irving, Tex.

## **Swiss Project**

by Bob Wolfenbarger BAUMA -- As winter approaches in northern Switzerland, a Swiss family committee in this Zurich Canton village of 4,500, original home of the clan, is planning the first steps in the construction of a memorial at the site of the Wolfensbergers' long-vanished family castle near this village. Delayed by a vicious winter storm a year ago, the project is expected to be built by the family association's Swiss partners during 2001. If no further delays occur, the Board of Directors hopes to dedicate the family memorial at a public ceremony late next year.

The project is the result of a partnership of the WFA and two Swiss non-profit organizations, the Verkehrsverein Bauma, a tourist organization, and the Zuercher Wanderwege, a cantonal hiking group. The WFA has committed \$6,500 in member funds to build the project, a figure matched by fundings from these two Swiss associations. When completed, the project will add another picnic area and hiking paths to a network of such facilities throughout Switzerland. The family's representatives are part of a Bauma-based committee headed

of a Bauma-based committee headed by Heini Wolfensberger of Bauma, an honorary member of the Board of Directors. Also a member is Max Wolfensberger of Stafa, a director of the WFA for the past four years. The funds will construct hiking paths, stairs, bridges and a picnic area with a barbecue at the site of the onetime castle. A plaque in German and English will recognize the significance of the site to the Wolfensberger family.

To assist members who've pledged or contributed to the project, the WFA is seeking designation by the Internal Revenue Service as a non-profit organization. When the IRS has finally determined the WFA's status, contributors will be informed of the change in status. Once designated as a non-profit, member contributions should be tax-deductible.
